Avedis H. Seferian - Citizen of the World



Ask Avedis Seferian where he is from and you are likely to get a grin and a polite inquiry into how much time you have available to devote to getting an answer.

The son of a diplomat, Avedis spent his formative years living in several different countries. He holds three degrees from three separate continents - a Bachelor's in Economics from St. Stephen's College, Delhi University in India; an MBA from the American University of Armenia; and a Juris Doctor from the Georgetown University Law Center in the United States. He credits that nomadic lifestyle for instilling in him a constant curiosity about different cultures, customs and cuisines. He speaks five languages (and can curse in quite a few more!) and feels that his inability to answer the simple question, "Where are you from?" is at least compensated for by his being able to feel at home in many different parts of the world.

And that's one of the things Avedis likes best about his work at WRAP. "Every single day brings interaction with people from different countries all around the globe, whether through travel, email or phone calls. I can't think of too many jobs where you'll get off a three way conference call involving people in the US, the UK and Hong Kong and then turn around and chat with someone in Bangladesh

before heading out the door to catch a flight to India," he says. For someone with his multi-cultural experiences and background, the task of managing WRAP's certification program - with factories spread over 60 countries - and interfacing with the organization's many monitoring partners, who are likewise all over the world, is well suited indeed.

Avedis joined WRAP in 2004 and is currently the in-house counsel and Director of Compliance Administration. A licensed attorney, he readily made the switch from the for-profit world of law firm practice to the non-profit world of social compliance administration when he realized how much WRAP's mission resonated with him. Here's how he tells the story: "I was initially involved on a small project with WRAP and it was supposed to be a temporary gig. It didn't take long for me to see what a great outfit it was. Basically, here we have an independent monitoring firm providing a very valuable service, certifying that the rule of law is being followed in a given location. It seemed a good idea to have a lawyer running the certification program. So we talked and, as they say, the rest is history."

And, as far as he is concerned, it is a very rich history. Although he now calls the Washington, DC area his home (having lived there for the past 10 years, it's the longest stretch he has spent in any one place), he still considers himself a citizen of the world, and a lawyer with a simple mission: to ensure legal, ethical and humane manufacturing, be it in Detroit, Dublin, Delhi, Dhaka or Dongguan.

WRAP's Global Activities to Promote Social and Environmental Compliance

LiuAn City, China

Co-organized with WRAP, China Chamber of Commerce for Import and Export of Foodstuffs, Native Produce and Animal By-Products (CFNA) hosted the 1st China International Feather & Down Festival in LiuAn City, Anhui Province, China, on September 16-17, 2010. The festival aimed to build a platform for future cooperation between China and the international feather & down industry to advance the industry's sustainable development.

Together with the Italy-China Economic Relations and Trade Association, CFNA launched the 1st "Spectacular China Cup-China Feather and Down Fashion Design Contest" at the festival. The international contest integrated with Chinese fashion elements and attracted several fashion institutes in China.

Francis Yuk, Senior Vice President of WRAP, gave a featured presentation titled "US, EU Economics Update & Corporate Social Responsibility" at the festival. He also presented prizes to the winners of the "Spectacular China Cup" contest.

This Festival was also co-organized by China Ministry of Foreign Economic Relations & Trade (MOFERT) Shanghai Branch, Szechuan Commerce Bureau, CFNA Feather & Down Department, and LiuAn Commerce Bureau. CFNA and WRAP signed a Memorandum of Understanding and Cooperation on June 7, 2010.

New Delhi, India

Haiti Apparel Center Opens

Working through the US Agency for International
Development (USAID) and CHF International, [TC]² has
developed the first initiative for the training center in Port
au Prince with the Sewing Operator Training School.
Thirteen Sewing Operator Trainers were trained and two
classes of new operators had graduated and been deployed
into the work force when the earthquake struck in January,
and training was halted. The center was temporarily used

for emergency aid relief, but the building has been restored and the opening ceremonies were conducted on August 11, 2010. Sewing Operator Training classes resumed in September, 2010.

According to [TC]², the 30,000 square-foot center will be a training center for sewn product workers and will elevate the skills of the Haitian workforce. The center will not only instruct sewing machine operators, but will encompass in its teaching almost every level of worker in a sewn products factory, from the factory floor to executives. In addition to the operator training program, there will be a mechanics training course to develop technical capabilities, a middle management and supervisor development program to develop core competencies, and an executive seminar series that will focus on world-class business processes, technologies, and future industry direction. The first executive seminar was conducted by [TC]²'s President, Dr. Michael Fralix, following the center's opening ceremonies.

Will Duncan of [TC]² comments, "It is official! The ribbon has been cut and the Haiti Apparel Center is now a reality. The inauguration went very well, with about 180 in attendance. Over 50 individuals attended the first Executive seminar. Now that we have this wonderful center, the real work begins to finish developing and delivering training that will transform not just an industry, but a nation."
